

Mark 14:3-9

Application Deadline: Monday, April 20, 2020

Scholarship awards will be given in worship on Sunday, May 17, 2020.

A Scholarship is awarded to a student who:

- 1. Is a current member of CCBUCC and has attended CCBUCC for the three (3) consecutive years preceding the application;
- 2. Is active in church activities and any of the following: community service activities, extracurricular activities, or is working to pay for his/her education; and
- 3. Will be attending, or currently attends, a traditional two or four-year undergraduate college or trade school.

Applicant must supply evidence of high school graduation and acceptance at a two or four-year undergraduate college or trade school.

Previous year's recipients are invited to apply for renewal of the scholarship. This is a shorter form that requests information about activities at the student's college or university and other community activities.
